The Cadishead Primary Learning Promise:



In **Key Stage 1** ALL children will experience teaching and learning which stems from the following areas of key skills:

COMMUNICATION -

(Speaking, writing and using technology to communicate confidently listening and responding appropriately)

WORKING WITH OTHERS -

(Paired, small group and large group work; where children can take turns and share responsibilities and resources)

IMPROVING OWN LEARNING AND PERFORMANCE -

(Identifying strengths and areas for development; working independently and knowing when and how to seek for help)

By the end of **Key Stage One** the children will have been taught **geographical and historical knowledge, skills and understanding** through topics based on:

The Local Area

A contrasting locality either in the UK, the European Union or the World

Fieldwork investigations that take place outside the classroom

Family life and changes in their own, their families or others around them lives

The way of life of British people in the more distant past

The lives of significant men, women and children from Britain and the wider world

Past events from history of Britain and the wider world

Within the topics, the knowledge, skills and understanding for Art, Design and Technology, ICT, Music and Physical Education will be taught. Although these subjects may also be taught as a stand alone unit of work to ensure full coverage.

By the end of key stage one the children will have been taught scientific knowledge, skills and understanding through these topics:
